# **Grade 6 Summer Reading Program (Summer 2014)**

At CAJ, we want to encourage reading for pleasure, and we want everyone to discover the benefits of reading. We want you to become better readers, develop your reading comprehension, keep your minds active, learn about new places and time periods, and enrich your vocabulary. Please look over this description of the Grade 6 Summer Reading Program and plan which books you would like to read this summer!

# **Bible Class Requirement**

- Read *The Magician's Nephew* by C.S. Lewis. (We will loan you a copy of this novel in June to keep over the summer, which you must bring back in good condition in the fall.)
- Submit a written response by email to <a href="mailto:summer.reading6@caj.or.ip">summer.reading6@caj.or.ip</a> that includes:
  - One paragraph summarizing the **plot** of the novel
  - A second paragraph explaining a **theme** or **Biblical connection** you find in the novel
- As we will be using *The Magician's Nephew* in Bible class this fall, read it carefully to make sure you understand it well. It might be a good idea to save it to read nearer the end of summer vacation than the beginning.

## **Social Studies Class Requirement**

- Read your choice of one book from the <u>Grade 6 Social Studies Booklist</u>
- Answer some questions about the book you read. You can find the question form using this <u>link</u>. (Your answers will be displayed on the "Summer Reading Log" spreadsheet for your social studies teacher and classmates to read).

# **Bible and Science Class Requirement**

- Read your choice of one book from the <u>Grade 6 Bible and Science Booklist</u>
- Fill in a book cover with the following information:
  - **Side one:** Your name, title of book, name of author, and illustration
  - Side two: Page count and 2-3 sentences summarizing what you learned from the book
- Bring the book cover on the first day of school; book covers will be displayed on a bulletin board, so everyone can get good ideas for reading more books after the summer is over

### **Whole Class Goal**

- Our goal for Grade 6 is for the class to read a combined total of **200** books over the summer.
- You will help the class reach its goal by reading the **three required** books explained above and as many other books of your choice as you can!
- To keep track of our progress towards our goal, each time you finish reading a book, please
  add your name, title of book, author and page count to the <u>"Summer Reading Class Log"</u>

## **Deadline**

The deadline for the three requirements and the class goal of 200 books is **August 26th** (the first day of school). You need to meet this deadline in order for the class to be able to participate in the reward at the beginning of the school year!

# **Grade 6 Summer Reading FAQs**

## 1. How many books must I read?

You need to read a minimum of three books:

- The Magician's Nephew by C.S. Lewis
- One book from the Grade 6 Social Studies Booklist
- One book from the Grade 6 Bible and Science Booklist

# 2. Should I only read three books this summer?

**NO!** Together as a whole class, our goal is to read **200 books** (or more!) over the summer. If everyone only reads the required minimum of three books we won't reach our goal! What happens if we do reach the goal? You'll get a reward for being diligent readers!

# 3. Are books from the Grade 6 Booklists the only ones that will count towards the class goal of 200 books?

**NO!** Any book (other than picture books) can be counted towards the goal, including any book on the Grade 6 Bible, Science and Social Studies Booklists. You may also read from the Grade 6 GOR Book List if you'd like.

# 4. What if I lose my booklists or instructions?

#### 5. Where can I find the books that I need to read?

You will receive a copy of *The Magician's Nephew* from CAJ in June (or during the summer, for new students). This book will be checked out to you, so please take good care of it and return it in September.

All other books on the Grade 6 Booklists may be purchased through Amazon.com, are available at many bookstores and libraries in North America, or may be borrowed from the CAJ Library. Please note that the **library will be open on June 16**, **23**, **and 30** for you to borrow and/or return books.

Please understand that the three books are required reading for ALL students, including you. Students who receive EAL support will soon receive an email from Ms. Lewis about the EAL Summer Reading Log. The time you spend reading the three books for your Grade 6 Summer Reading Program can be written down on this form to contribute to your EAL summer reading requirements. (Depending on the length of the books you choose, you may need to read additional books to fulfill the EAL Summer Reading Log requirements. Check the information in the email you receive from Ms. Lewis for specific details.)
